



The Cabinet Art (see also Uptown/DC): Thru May 2: *Iterations* — *a Celebration of Stink Bugs*. This enticing series by Andy Unger, based on one image of a Brown Marmorated Stink Bug, was inspired by the ornamentation of the bug's shell. Using photography, digital editing, drawing, collage, rubbing and other techniques

in different combinations, Unger constructs elaborate images using transformations based on this natural camouflage. While remaining true to the bug's basic structure, the artist takes great liberties with other aspects of the images.

The repetition of the same outline reinforces their kinship while the variations make it clear that these are less a study of an insect than an investigation in image-making. Dense jewellike patterning in one image may become a soft, flat wash in another.
